
A person who tested positive went to a public establishment that was:

DHS Requirements for Facility-Wide Public Health Investigation

A single case initiates a facility-wide public health investigation in long-term care facilities, which includes skilled nursing facilities (nursing homes) and assisted living facilities (community-based residential facilities and residential care apartment complexes). Two or more cases within 28 days in the following settings initiate a facility-wide public health investigation:

- Group housing facilities include correctional facilities, homeless shelters, dormitories, and group homes.
- Health care facilities include hospitals, clinics, dialysis centers, hospice, and in-home care.
- Workplace (non-health care) settings include manufacturing and production facilities, distribution facilities, offices, and other indoor workplaces.
- Other settings include adult or child day care centers, restaurants, event spaces, and religious settings.
